School Responsibilities

Zane Middle School will:

Provide high-quality curriculum and instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment that enables the participating children to meet the State's student academic achievement standards as follows:

- Zane, in collaboration with the Eureka School District, provides professional development and training opportunities to ensure that teachers and staff are trained in best pedagogical practices.
- Ongoing staff training in Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports (PBIS) which is a school-wide student behavior management system that was originally implemented during the 2012-13 school year. We continue to provide ongoing training in our PBIS and Staff Meetings.
- Ongoing teacher training around the District adopted curriculum as well as Restorative Practices, Trauma Informed Practices, and Community Building Activities.
- Teachers have been trained in Constructing Meaning, a teaching method that allows all students, including native speakers and English Language Learners, access to the curriculum in a way that best ensures deep understanding of the material.
- Zane has an early release collaboration day each Monday where teachers and staff meet to collaborate and professionally develop in the areas of effective instruction and student achievement.
- Zane provides Intervention, Designated English and Study Skills Classes to support students.

Hold Student-Led Parent Conferences (with teacher support) in October.

Provide parents with Quarterly Report Cards (approximately every 10 weeks) and Student Progress Reports half-way through each quarterly marking period.
